Emergency Medical Kit for Practices and Games

Roll of toilet paper or large box of tissues (also comes in handy for those locations where there are no bathroom facilities).
☐ Cotton wool soaked in Otrivin for nose bleeds.
☐ Baby wipes.
☐ Ice packs.
☐ Band-Aids.
Cell phone numbers of all the parents.
☐ Latex Gloves.
☐ Saline and contact cases for players with contacts.
\square A back-up pair of contacts for all players who wear contacts in case they lose one. Ask each player to put their contact lenses in a labeled zip lock bag.
☐ Plastic bags to dispose of bloody gauze, etc.
☐ Hydrogen Peroxide (very useful for getting blood out of a jersey).
☐ Feminine hygiene products for teenage girls.
☐ REMEMBER: Put your emergency medical kit in the car and bring it out during practices and games, just as you would with other equipment such as cones and balls.
